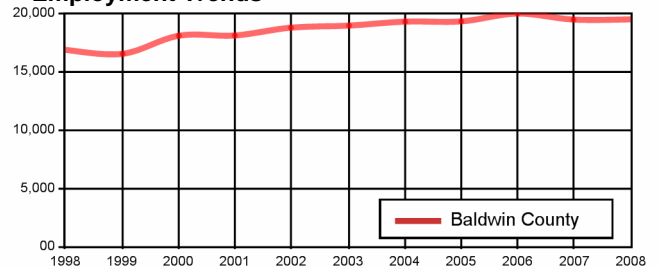

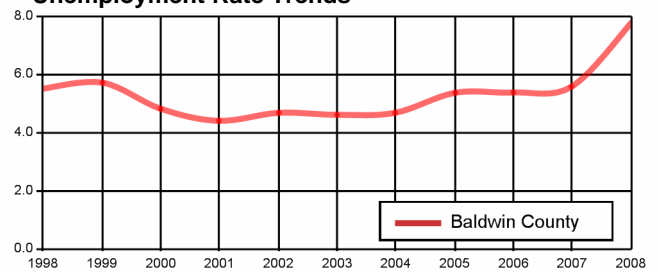

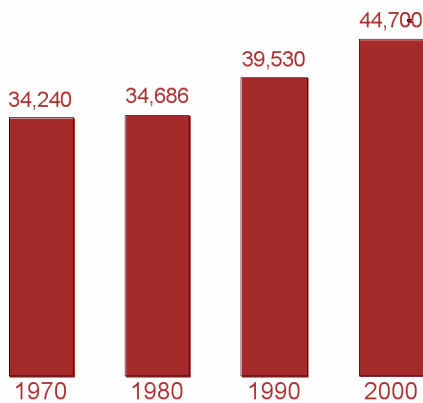
### Employment Trends

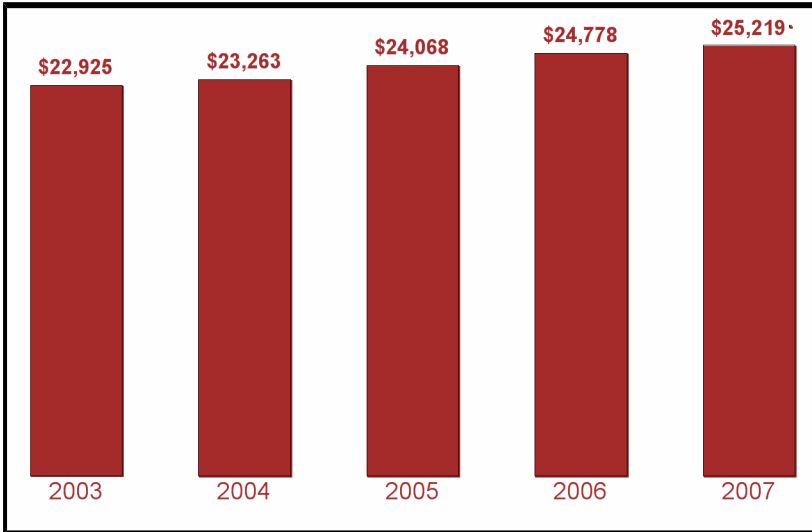

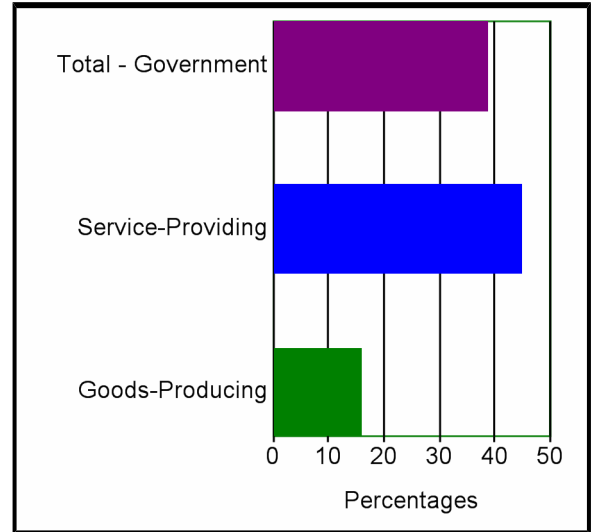
## Baldwin Per Capita Income
