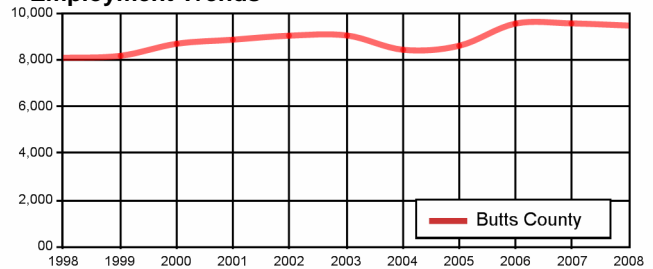

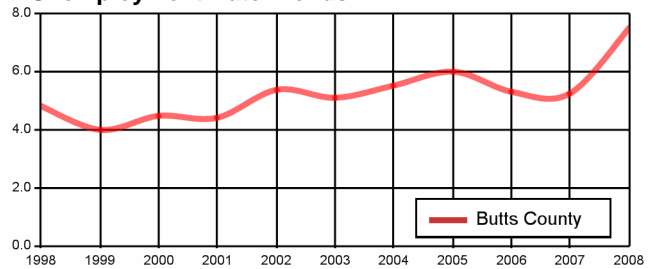

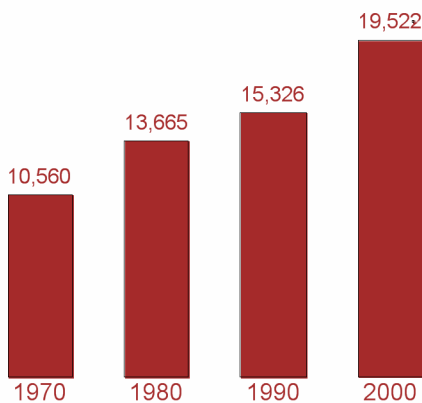
Employment Trends

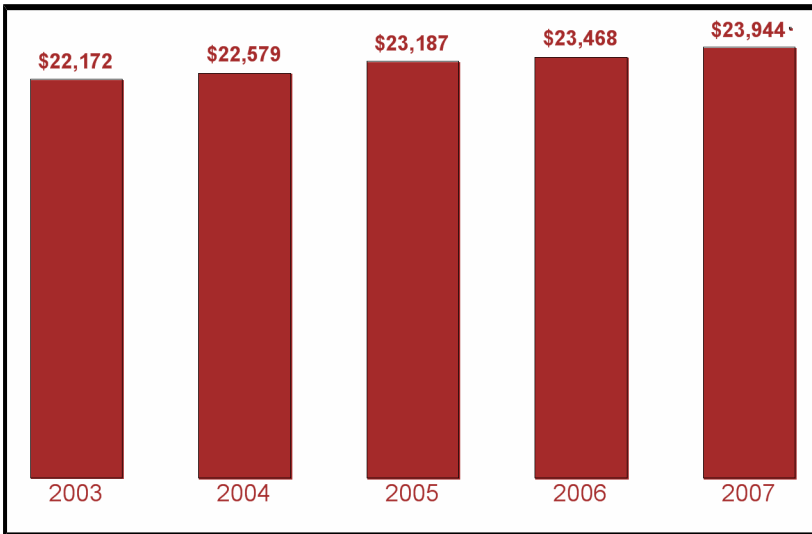

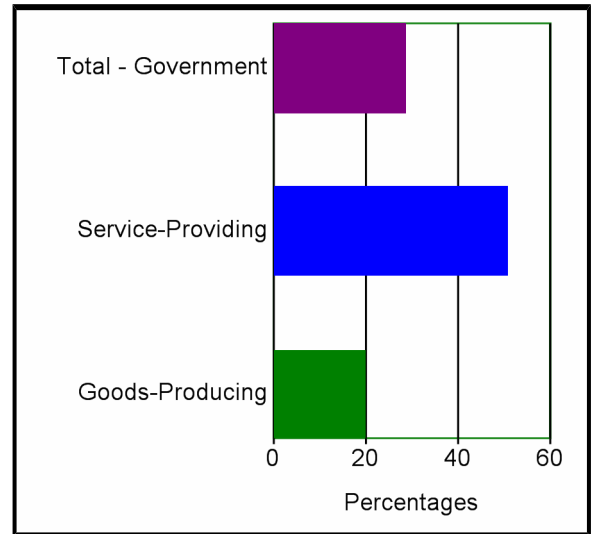
Butts Per Capita Income
