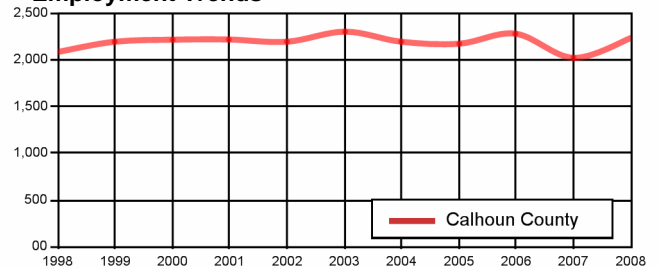

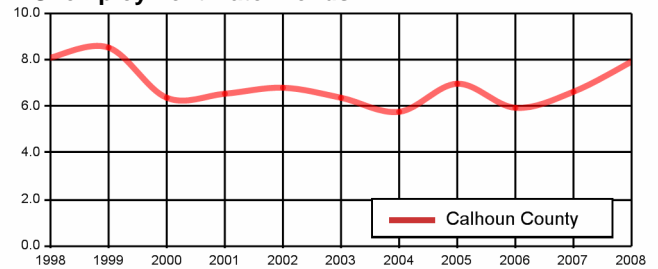

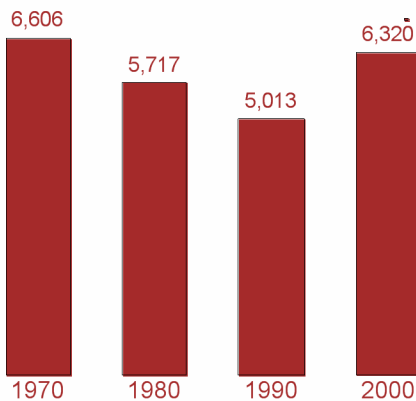
Employment Trends

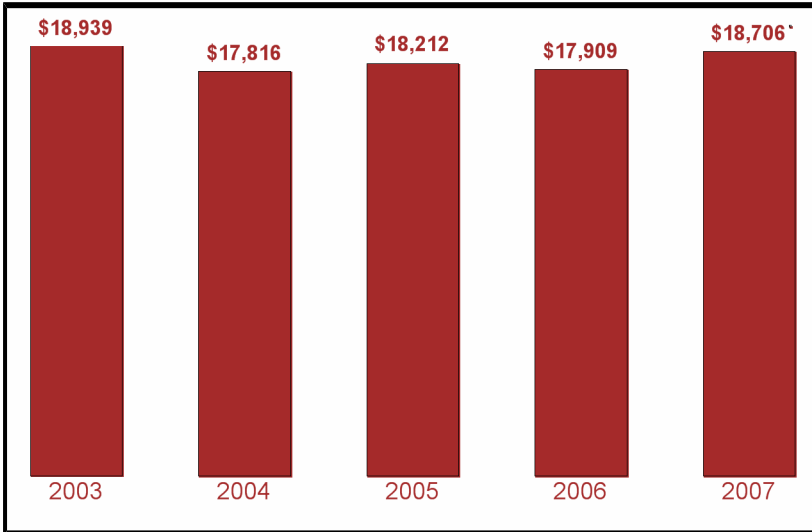

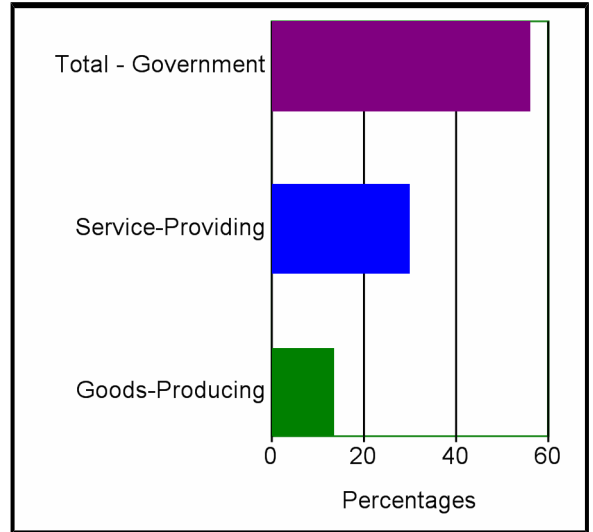
Calhoun Per Capita Income
