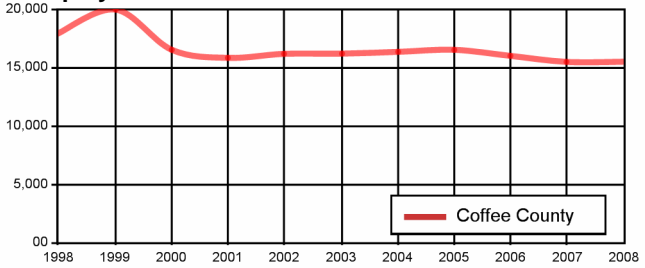

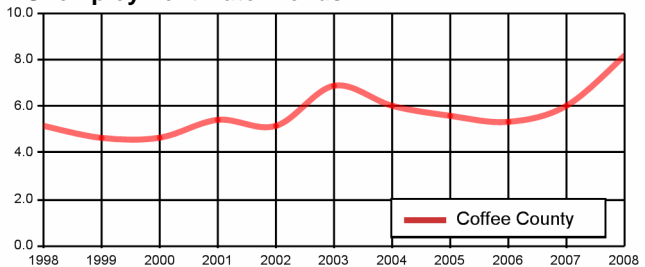

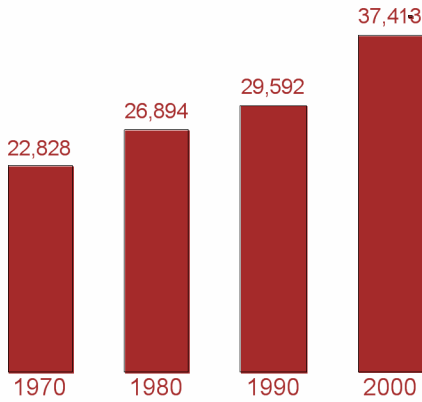
Employment Trends

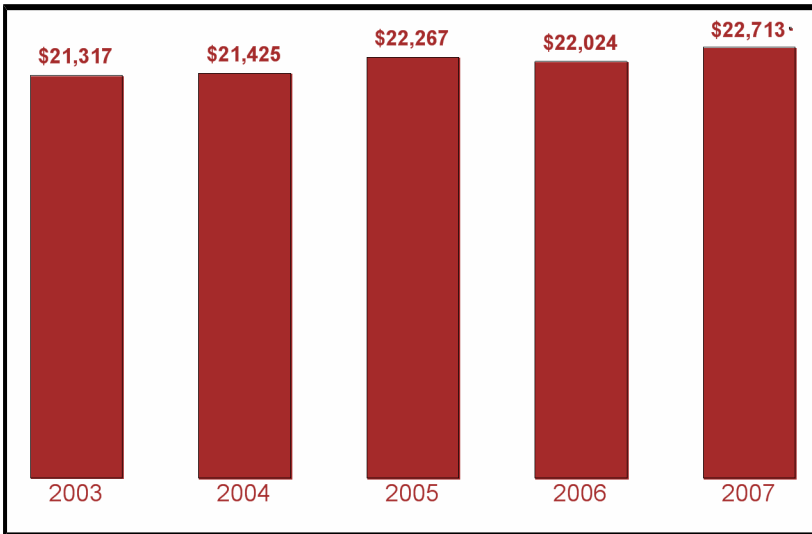

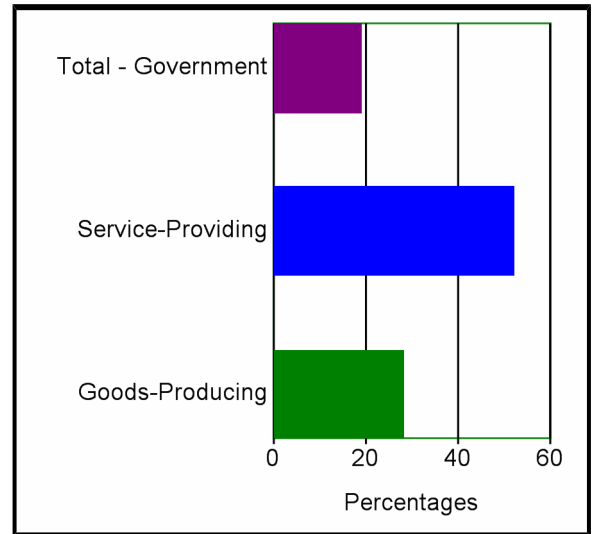
Coffee Per Capita Income
