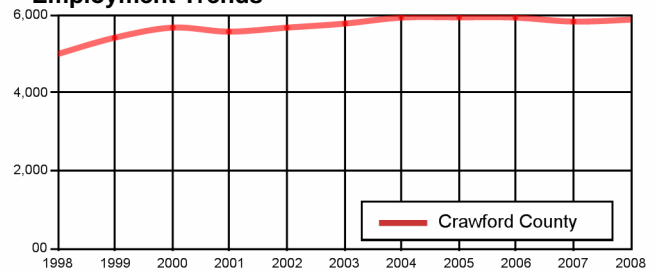

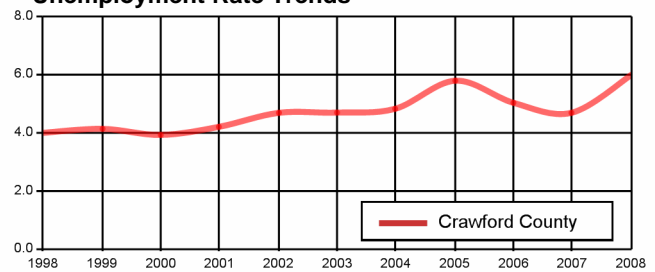

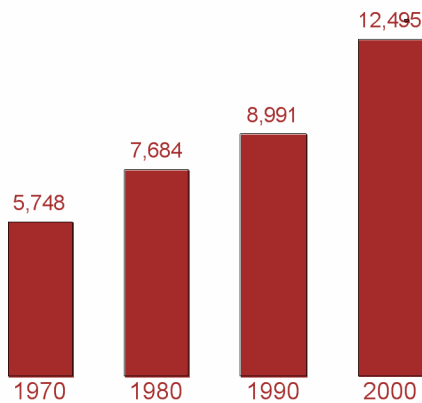

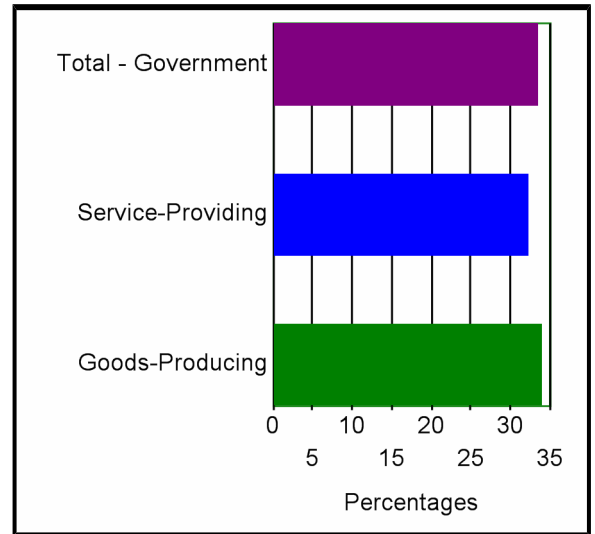
## Crawford Per Capita Income
