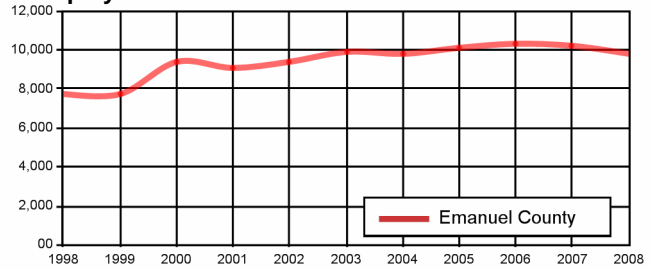

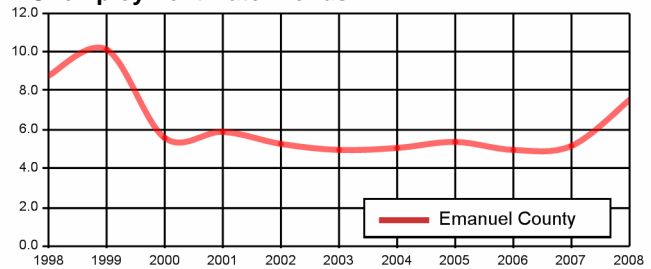

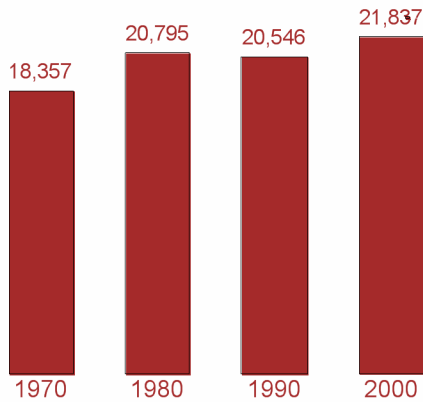
Unemployment Rate Trends

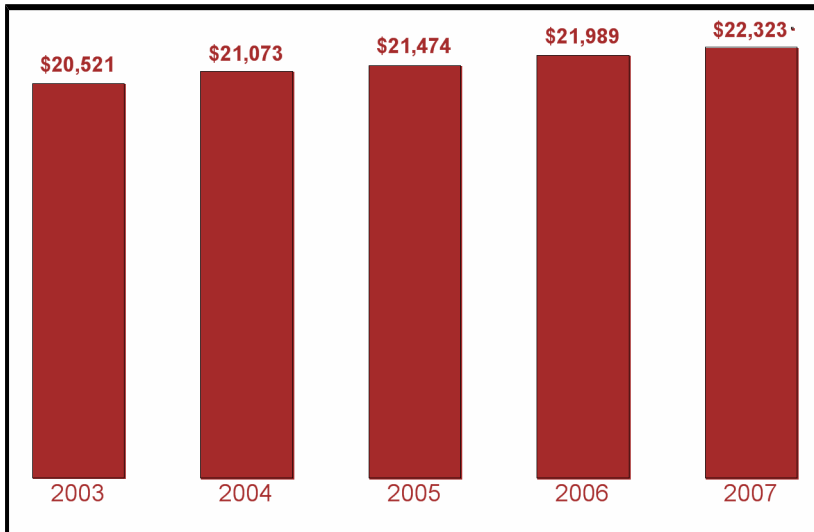

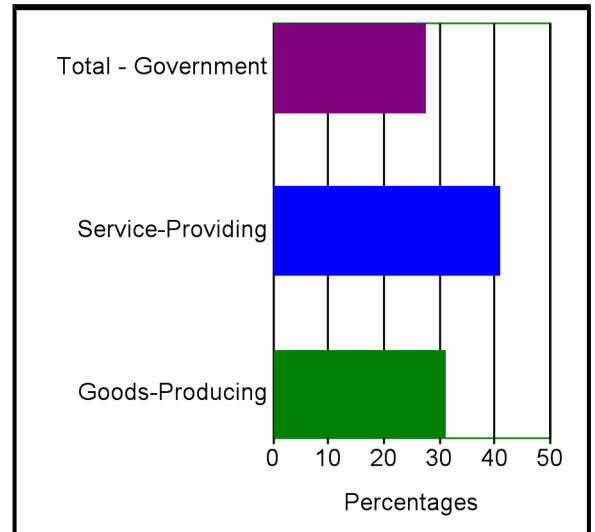
Emanuel Per Capita Income
