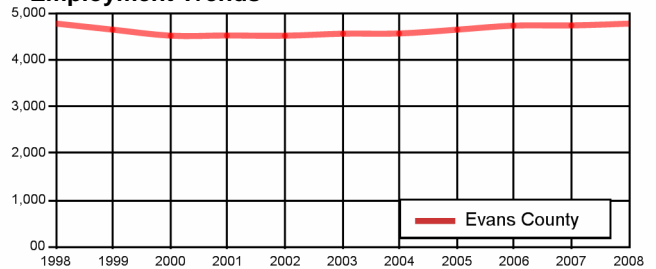

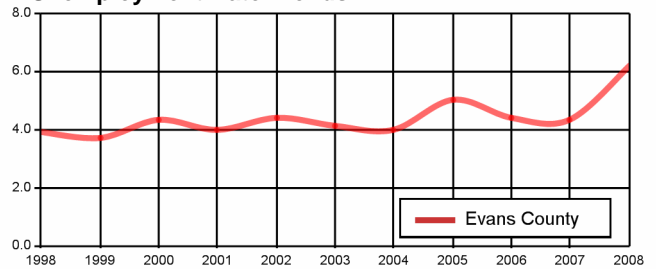

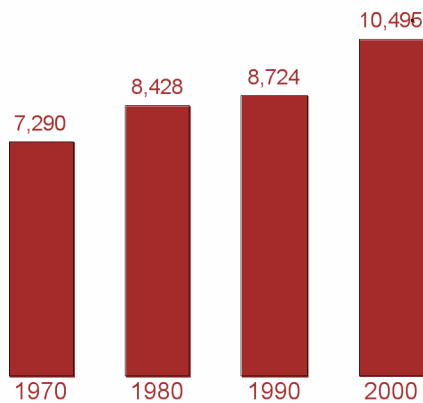
Employment Trends

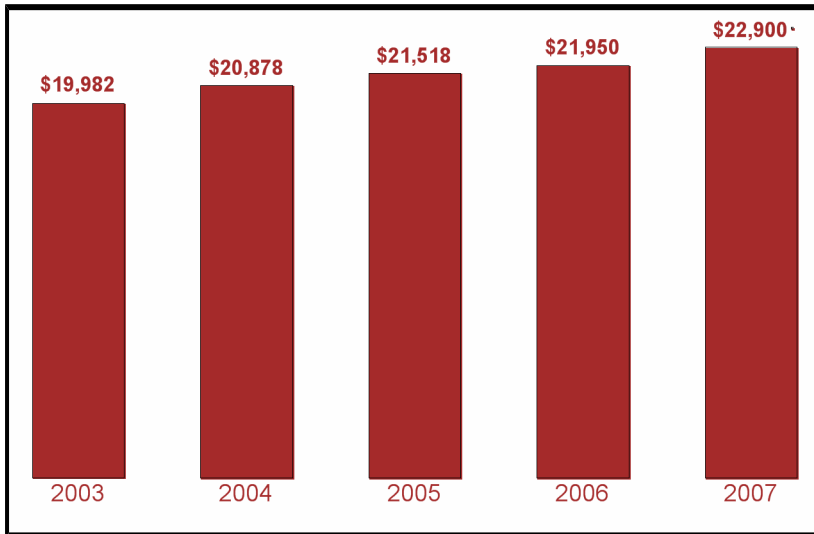

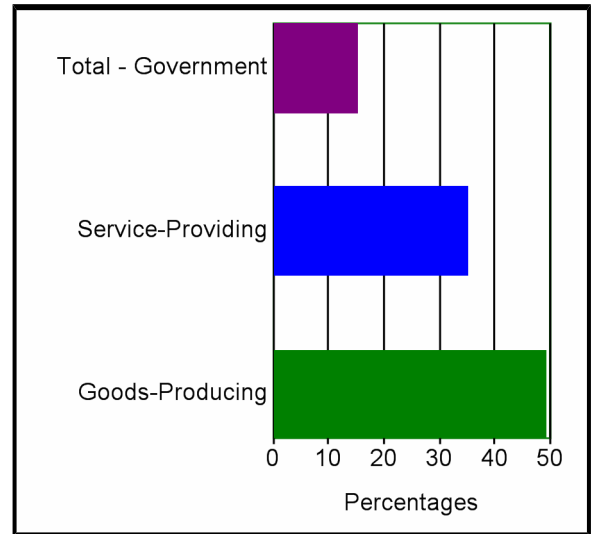
Evans Per Capita Income
