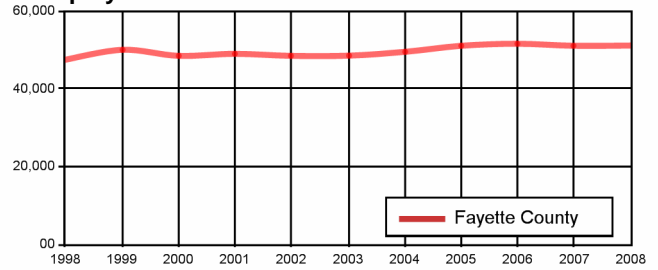

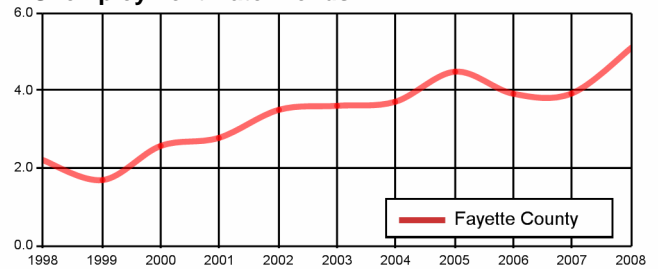

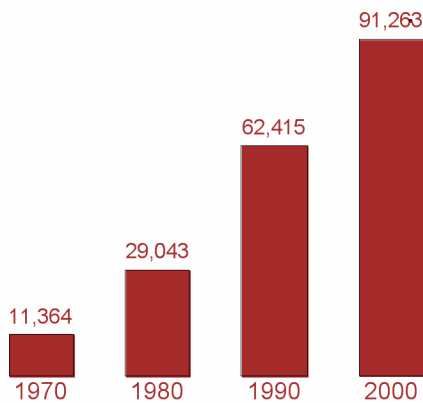
#### Employment Trends

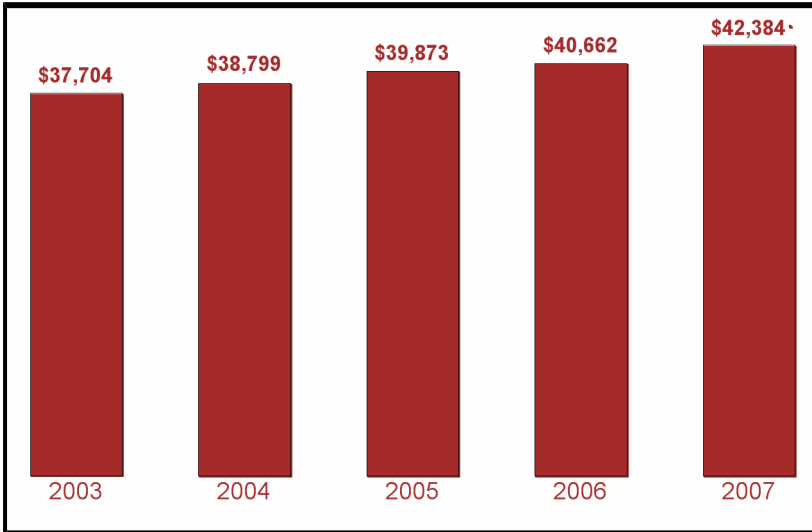

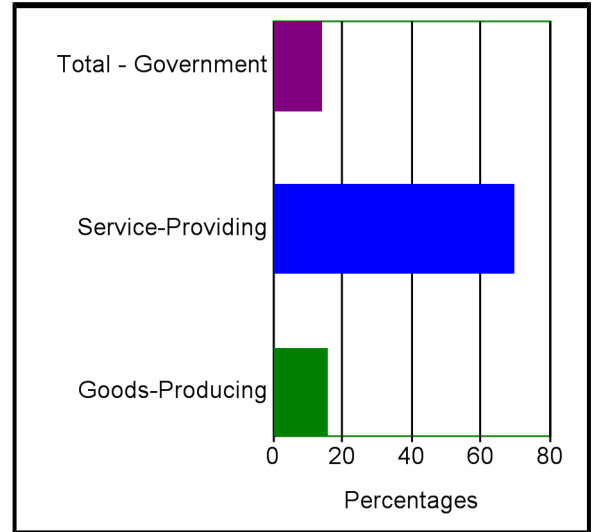
## Fayette Per Capita Income
