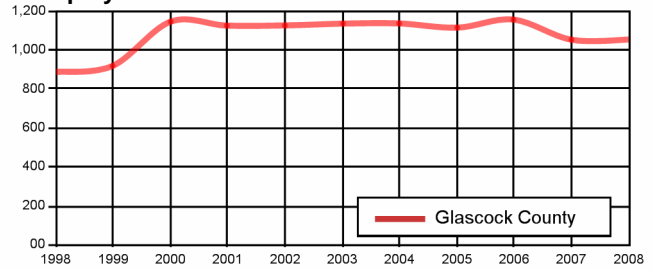

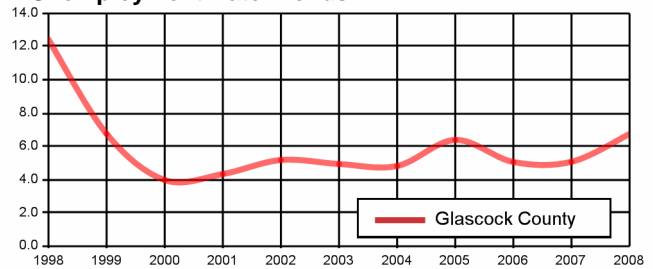

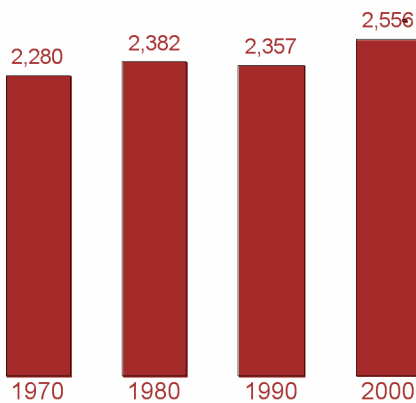

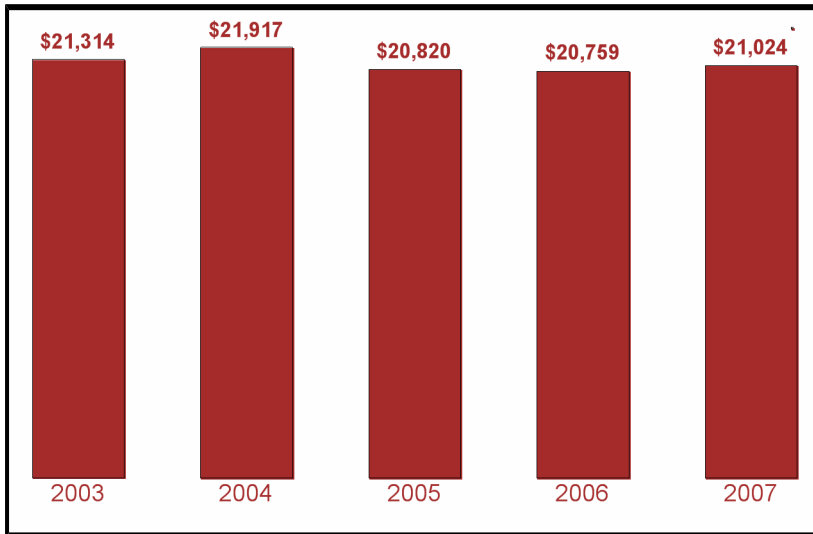

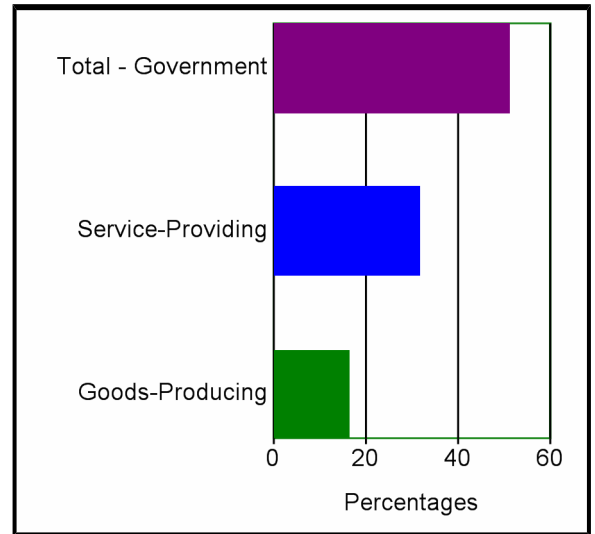
Glascok Per Capita Income
