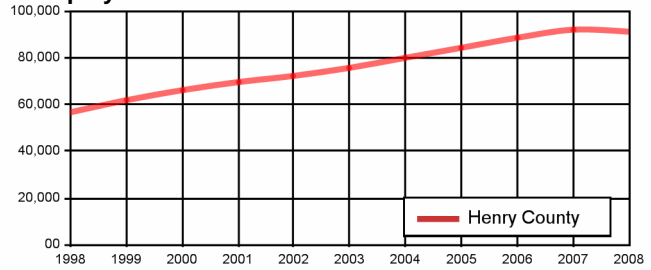

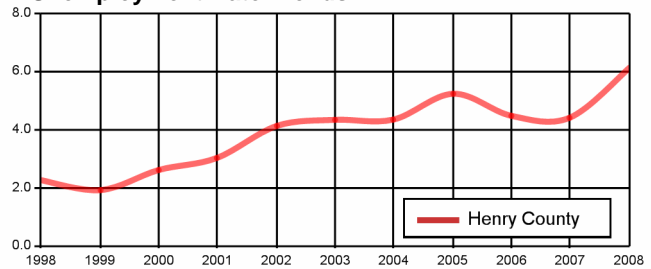

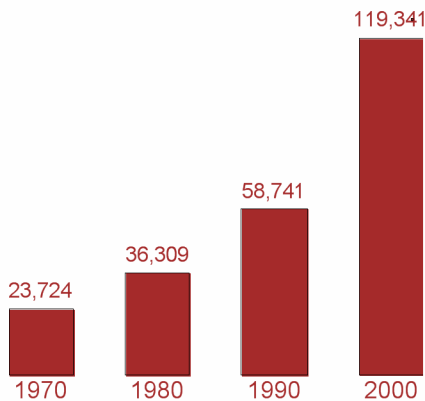
Employment Trends

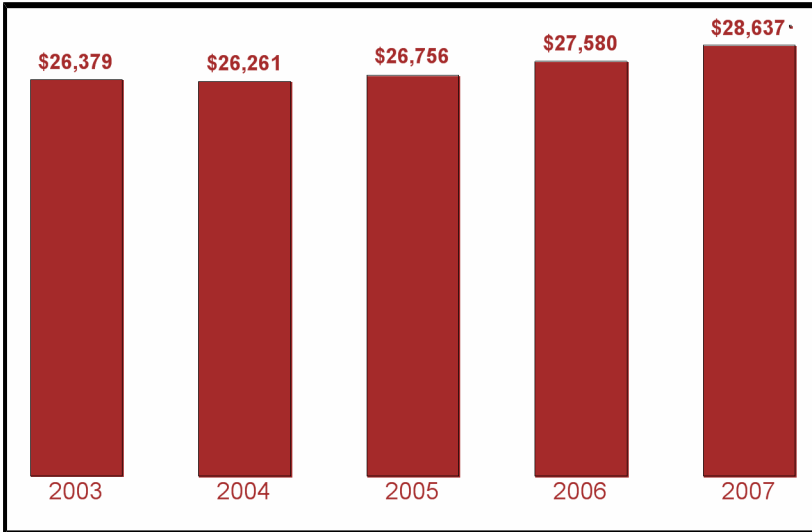

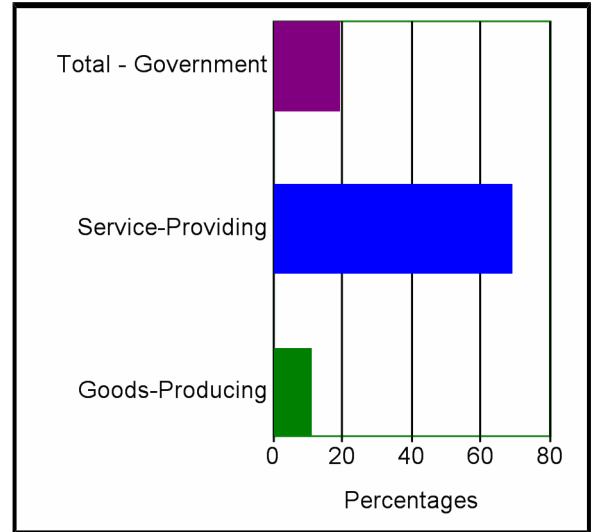
Henry Per Capita Income
