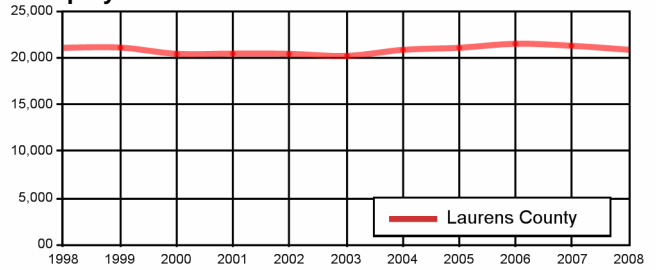

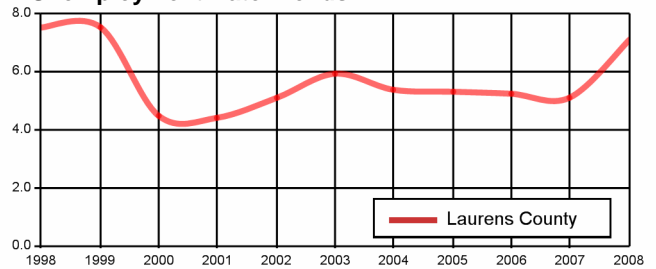

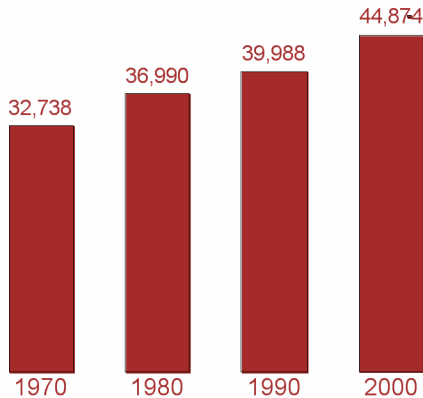
**Unemployment Rate Trends**

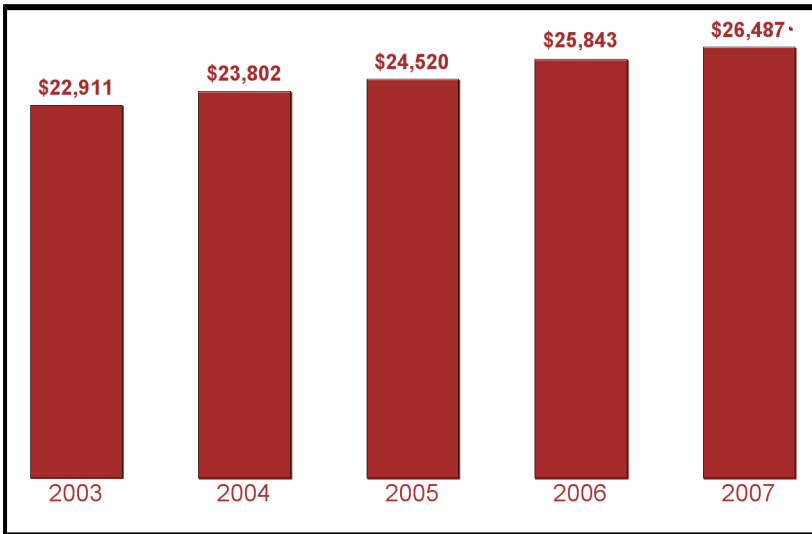

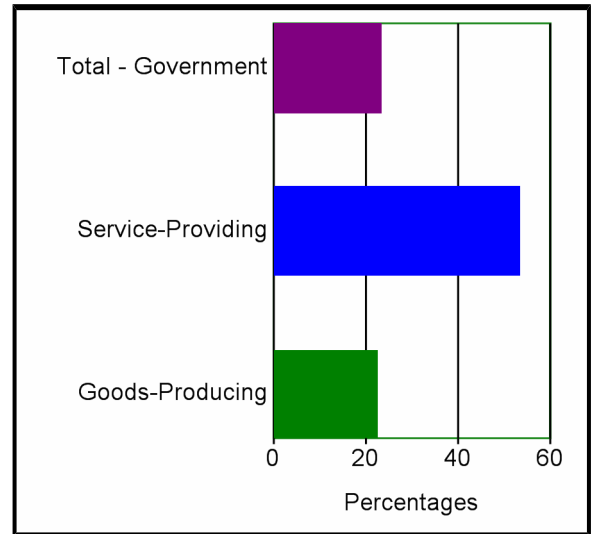
## Laurens Per Capita Income
