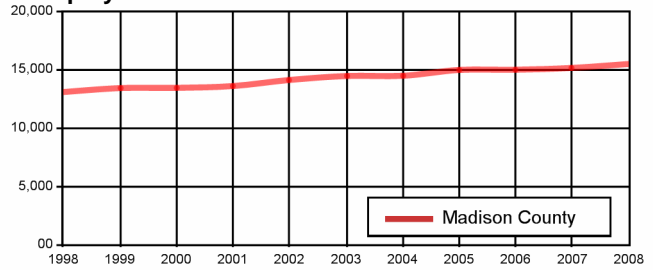

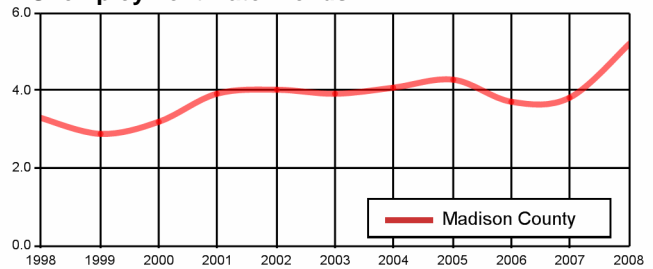

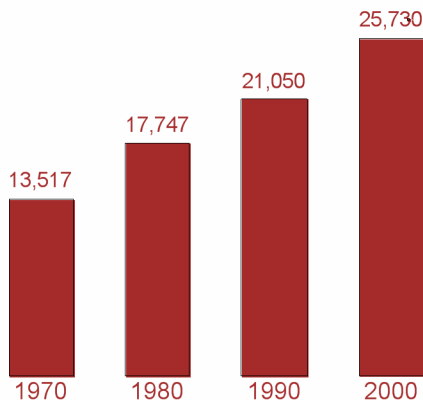
**Unemployment Rate Trends**

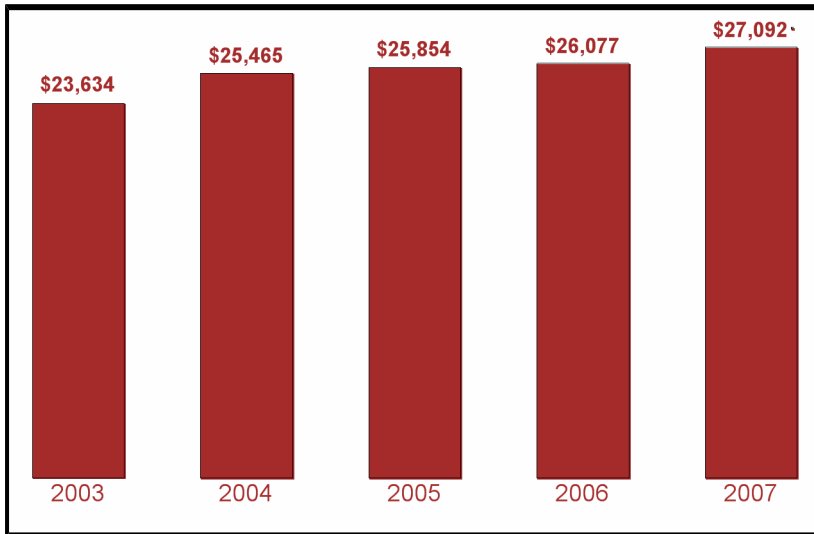

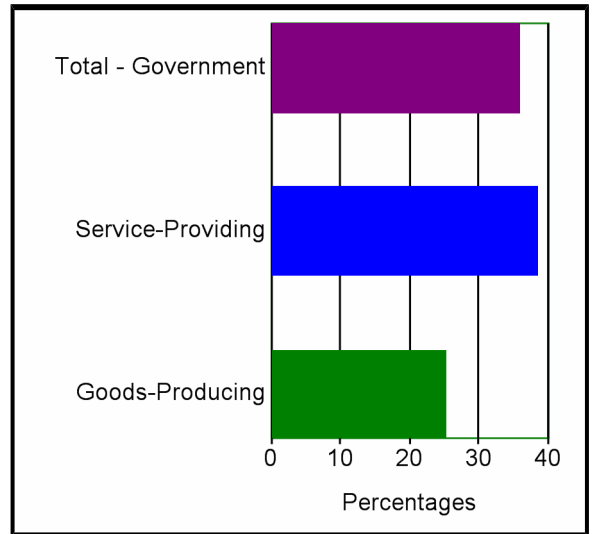
## Madison Per Capita Income
