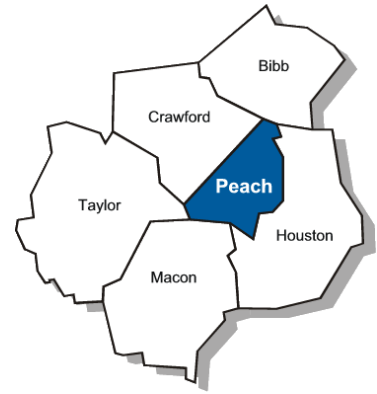

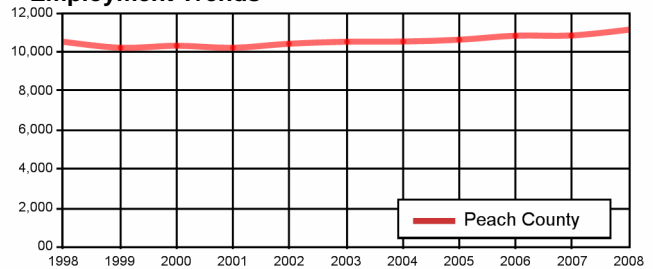

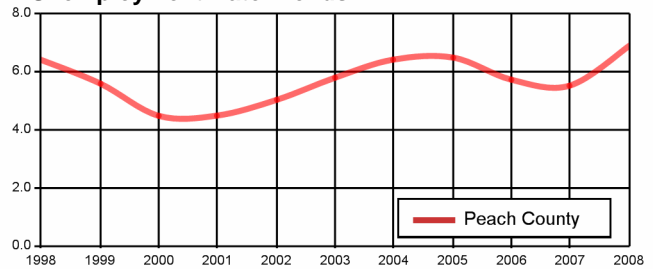

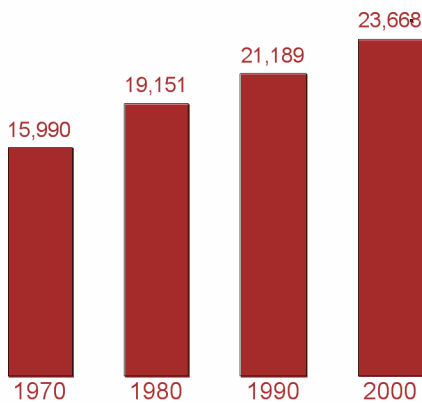
Employment Trends

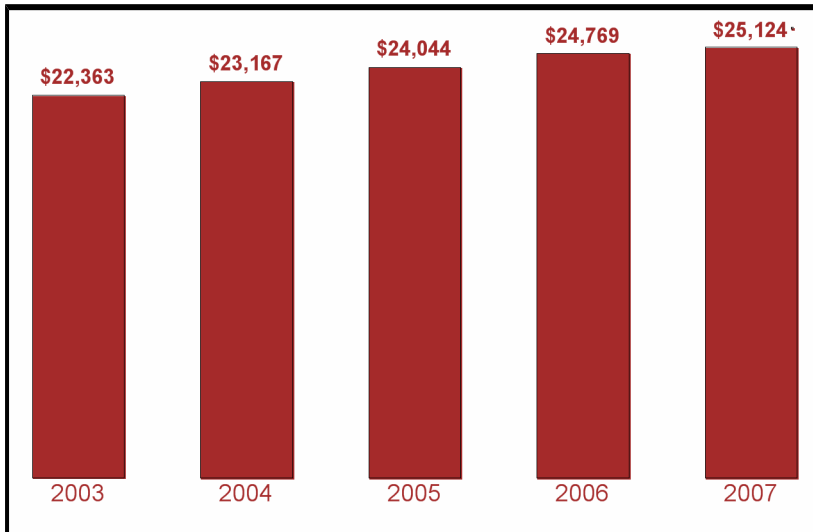

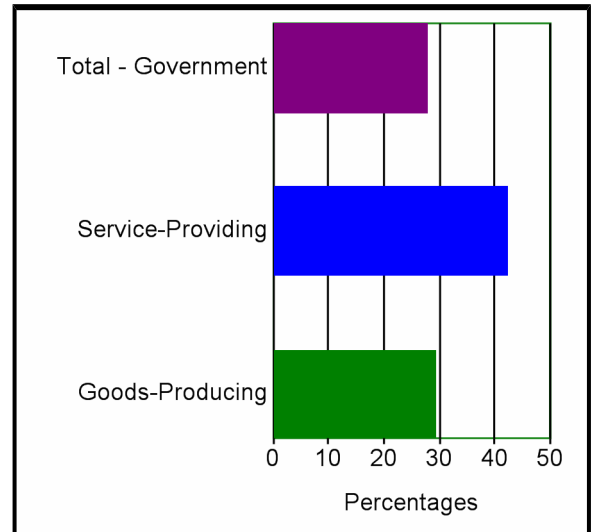
Peach Per Capita Income
