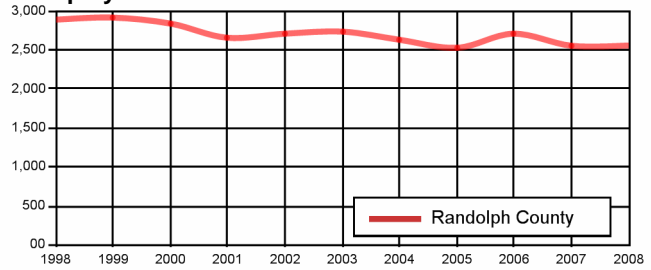

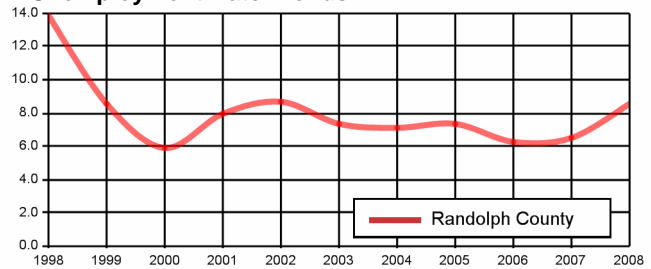

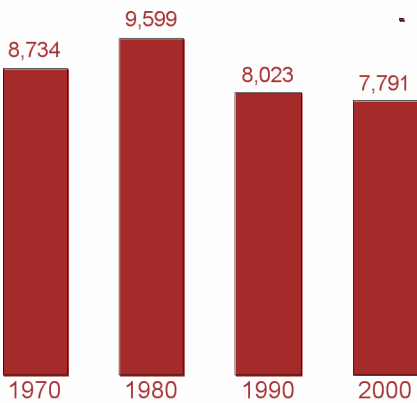
### Employment Trends

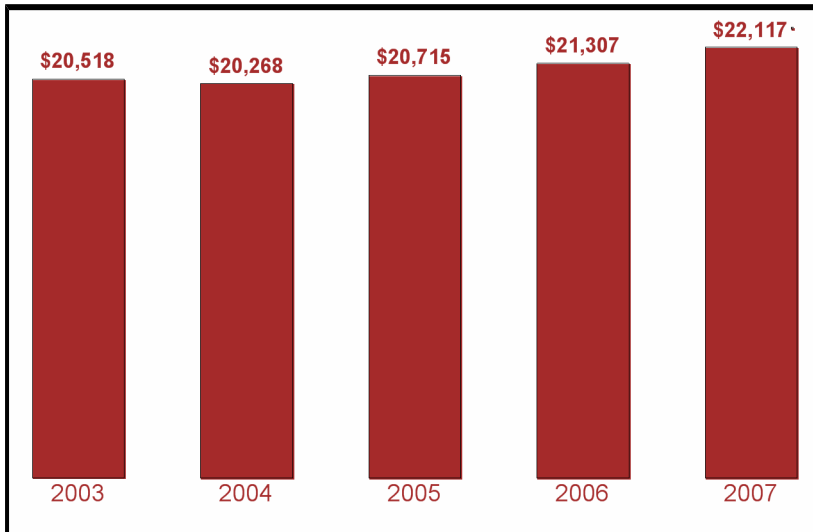

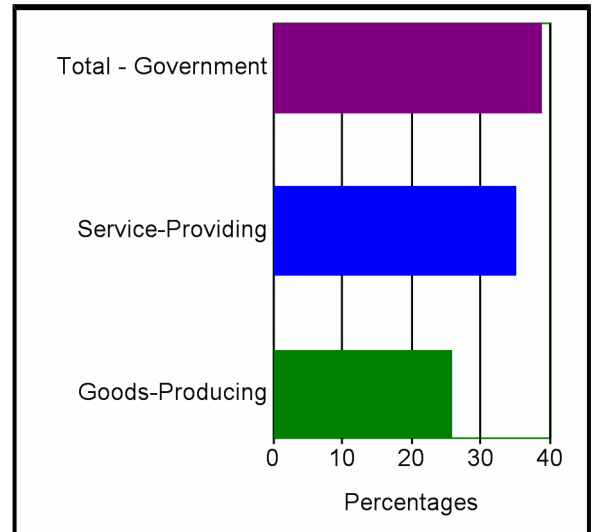
## Randolph Per Capita Income
