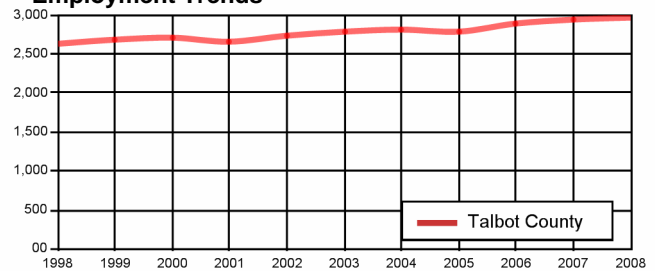

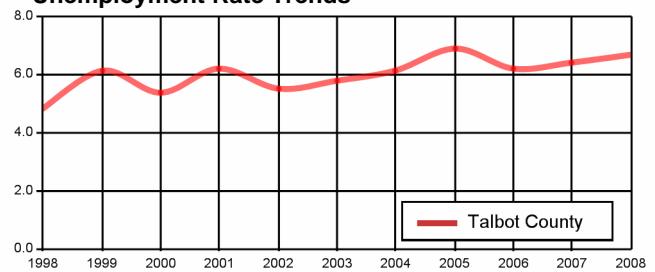

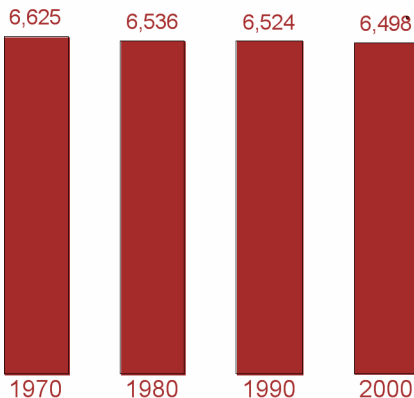
### Employment Trends

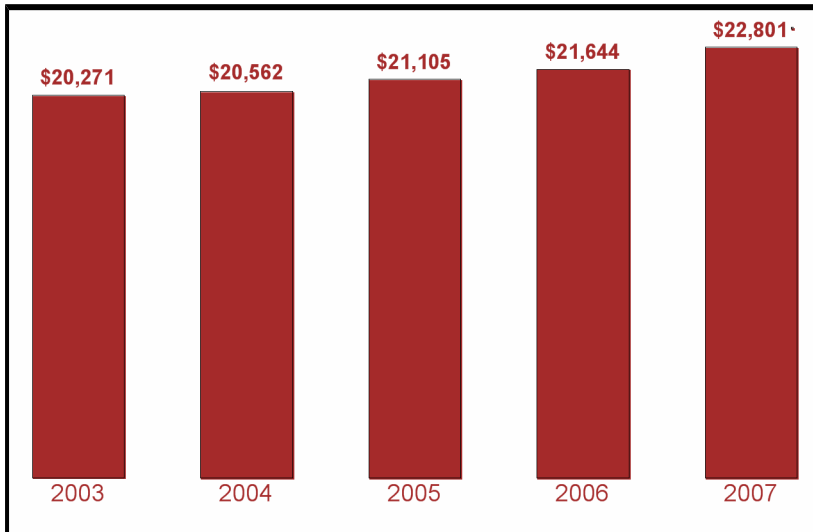

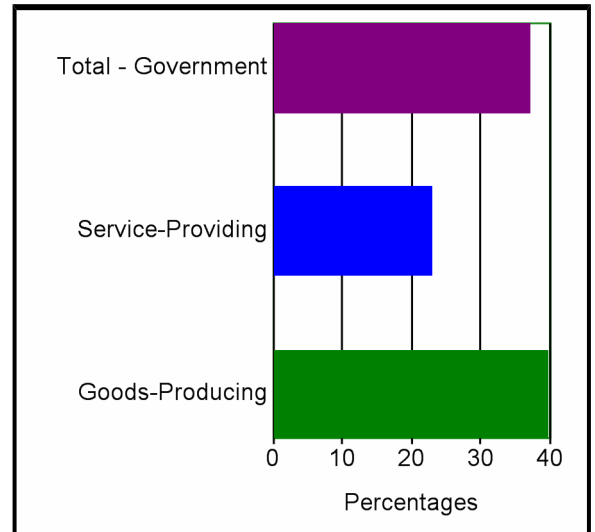
## Talbot Per Capita Income
